BIODIGESTERS: TRANSFORMING WASTE INTO SUSTAINABLE WEALTH

With the support of our partner **Tchibo**, at **Coffee Care**, we are exploring innovative solutions to reduce environmental pollution in the coffee industry.

During October, we implemented a pilot project with the installation of two biodigesters of different sizes to evaluate their functionality and determine the best way to treat organic waste.



One of these biodigesters was installed at the home of a coffee grower with a key purpose: to test whether it is possible to generate biofertilizer and biogas from coffee pulp.

The two main objectives of this initiative are:

- To significantly reduce the pollution generated by coffee processing.
- To lower the living costs of producers by enabling them to generate two essential inputs—fertilizer and gas—thereby reducing their dependence on external supplies and strengthening both their economy and sustainability.
